

Conflicts of Interest Policy

It is good practice for trustees to assume that any conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest should be identified and raised as soon as it is considered. This means that the board of trustees should be constantly vigilant to "potential" conflict.

The charity's interests must always be and be seen to be paramount in trustee decision-making.

- (i) A Trustee must not benefit from his trust
- (ii) A Trustee must not allow himself to be placed in a situation where his personal interest conflicts or may conflict or may be perceived as conflicting with the interest of the Trust

The trustees of Lingfield United Trust will seek the advice of the Almshouse Association and/or The Charity Commission if they consider they need such advice.
